**1 Peter 4:10-11** Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.

1 Cor. 12 (vs. 4-6) There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them all. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work.

(vs. 11) He distributes them (gifts) to each one, just as he determines.

(vs. 12, 24-25, 27) Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ...But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other....Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it.

1. You might be thinking, "I thought this was an assessment to help me find my career." But in God's kingdom, a career is a tool God uses to build His Kingdom. We have been left on this earth for one purpose: To know Him and Make Him Known. (1 Peter 3:15) God uses us as His kingdom builders. Reflecting on your strengths, personal approach and the previous scriptures, how does this information help you fulfill your purpose in the church and in your spheres of influence God has placed you.

2. Recognizing your strengths and those of the people around you is important because it helps the body function well. Understanding your weaknesses is equally as important. Why would it be important? How does grace play a role in the body of believers?

3. Look at your list of suggested careers from each of the assessments. Did any of the careers surprise you? Which ones?

It is important to remember that this is a starting point to begin exploring what God may be calling you to. You are not limited to these careers, but it widens your gaze at what you may be good at. You may be asking yourself, "There are quite a few options. How do I know which one is the right one?" The amazing thing about God is that if you are seeking Him and following His known revealed will from Scripture, your future may include multiple options that are all good. Here are some steps that can help you discern the direction you should go:

- a. Start with what interests you.
- b. Find opportunities to speak with someone in that field and their experiences.
- c. Shadow someone in that field. The more you know what the career is like, the more you may recognize whether you feel called to it or not.

**WARNING:** Sometimes God calls you to careers and places you NEVER dreamed you would do. Think about the following people:

Moses – Introvert, Not a good speaker – Called to lead the Israelites

Gideon – Hiding from the enemy, hesitant to lead – Called to save His people from the Midians

Daniel – Called to serve a people group hostile to God

Jonah – Called to preach to people he saw as the enemy

Matthew, James, John and all the disciples – Thought their jobs were to be fishermen, tax collectors, religious leaders only – Called to be disciples that would give up everything

4. Obviously, we cannot go back to interview these fellow believers (maybe in heaven), but you have people around you that have walked through this decision process. Ask your parents how they came to the decision about what they are doing now. How do they feel God uses their career in building His kingdom?
