## ADMISSION MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

#### **Research Universities**

**Oklahoma State University**<sup>1</sup> - Score a 24 ACT/1160 SAT<sup>2</sup> **or** have a 3.0 GPA and rank in the top 33 percent of your class **or** have a 3.0 GPA and a 21 ACT/1060 SAT<sup>2</sup> **or** score between current OSU admission standards and the minimum State Regents' standards (22 ACT/1020 SAT<sup>2</sup> or unweighted high school core curriculum GPA of at least 3.0), cognitive factors (60%) and non-cognitive factors (40%).

**University of Oklahoma** - Applications are evaluated using a holistic admissions process that takes into account academic success as well as several other factors.<sup>3</sup> You should fulfill the following requirements: take required high school classes and graduate from an accredited high school or have a GED and take the ACT or SAT exam.

#### **Public Liberal Arts University**

*University of Science and Arts of Oklahoma* - Score a 24 ACT/1160 SAT<sup>2</sup> and have a 3.0 GPA or rank in the top 50 percent of your class **or** have a 3.0 GPA and rank in the top 25 percent of your class **or** have a 3.0 GPA and an 22 ACT/1100 SAT<sup>2</sup>.

#### **Regional Universities**

Score a 20 ACT/1030 SAT<sup>2</sup> or have a 2.7 GPA and rank in the top 50 percent of your class or have a 2.7 GPA in the 15 high school core courses required for college entry.

#### **Community Colleges**

You don't need to make certain scores, but you should fulfill the following requirements: take required high school classes **and** graduate from an accredited high school or have a GED **and** take the ACT or SAT exam.



## ACT VS. SAT

- Register for national test @ act. org
- PreACT October as 10<sup>th</sup> grade at school
- ACT starting in Spring at school
- English, Math, Reading, Science, Writing (Optional)
- Total score range: 1-36
  - Each section uses a scale of 1-36. Your total score is the average of your four section scores.
  - The optional Writing section uses a scale of 2-12 and does not count toward your final score.

- Register for national test @ sat. org
- PSAT October as 10<sup>th</sup>/11<sup>th</sup>, National Merit Qualifying test during Junior year
- Reading, Writing, Math (No calc),
   Math(w calc), Essay (Optional)
- Total score range: 400-1600
  - The Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (EBRW) and Math sections each use a scale of 200-800 and are combined for a total score.
  - The optional Essay uses three separate scales of 1-8 and does not count toward your final score.







These 27 credits meet the minimum requirements established by Southwest Covenant Schools and the State of Oklahoma for a college preparatory diploma. SWCS highly recommends that any student who desires to compete for academic merit scholarships consider taking an advance math and an upper level computer course. Algebra 1 and Computer 1 taken in eighth grade will count toward graduation credit requirements, but the grade will not be included in the cumulative GPA. Students placed on an accelerated math track in 8th grade must take an advance math course.

## SCHOLARSHIPS

- OK Regents Academic Scholars Program
  - Scholarship for attending an Oklahoma college or university
  - Up to eight-semesters
  - Amount depends on the school
    - Ex) OU/OSU/TU ~ \$5500
      - 4 year college ~ \$4000
      - 2 year college ~ \$3500
  - Requirements: Total Sum of ACT scores = 138
    - National Merit or ACT at/above 99.5% automatically qualified
    - Can also be nominated by the university smaller amount

#### ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

#### ACADEMIC SCHOLARS PROGRAM

The Academic Scholars Program, established by the state Legislature and governor in 1988 and operated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, provides scholarships to academically outstanding students who attend an Oklahoma college or university.

Academic Scholars receive a scholarship to help cover the cost of room, board, tuition, books and incidental fees for up to eight semesters. The actual value of the scholarship varies based on the institution the scholar chooses to attend.

This program should not be confused with the Oklahoma State Department of Education's Oklahoma Academic Scholars. Before the creation of the Academic Scholars Program, the State Department of Education had an award called "Oklahoma Academic Scholar." The student has to meet certain criteria to receive this recognition. It should be noted that this is a recognition only, not a scholarship. ### COLLEGE CREDIT WHILE IN HIGH SCHOOL

- Dual Credit: Take class here at school = Get college credit at Colorado Christian University; Take Junior and Senior Year
- 2. Concurrent Enrollment: Enroll at a college and take classes while in high school; Start summer after sophomore year; Some schools offer a tuition waiver
- 3. <u>CLEP</u>: Exams you take to receive credit for a college course
