- **PSAT and ACT**
  - PSAT is **Wednesday, Oct. 14<sup>th</sup>**. Cost is \$17. Practice tests will be given through class. Online prep available at [www.satpractice.org](http://www.satpractice.org)
  - ACT Prep in three steps:
    1. ACT Workshop: Test Strategies
    2. Practice Test using test strategies; Online prep available [academy.act.org](http://academy.act.org)  
Recommended books – Kaplan or Princeton Review
    3. One-on-One tutoring as needed
  - ACT dates: ACT **School Test Days** are **Oct. 6<sup>th</sup> and Mar. 2<sup>nd</sup>**. CEEB code for SWCS: **374-018**; A student may take the ACT up to 12 times. The writing test is optional. ACT w/o writing -\$55.00; w/ writing -\$70.00
- **College Credit**
  - Dual Credit Program – SWCS has partnered with Colorado Christian University to offer the opportunity to receive college credit for a limited number of specific courses taken at SWCS; \$200 per course
  - Concurrent Studies: Though SWCS does not offer concurrent courses during the school day, students may consider summer options. Tuition waiver is available for seniors.

- Super Kids Day – Celebrate with elementary students a great school year with a fun track and field day.
- Junior-Senior Banquet – Prepare an entertaining evening to honor our graduating seniors. Weekly planning meetings will be held during lunch. JSB is **April 9<sup>th</sup>**.
